

Alphabet Pillow Blocks  
Letter "C"  
Pattern by Kimberly Lewis  
A Woven and Spun Creation



This pattern is dedicated to the "C's" in my life...Cassandra and Christopher. ☺

Materials

Worsted Weight Yarn

Size I Crochet hook ( a smaller hook will produce a tighter stitch and smaller letter)

Polyester Fiber Fill

Stitch Marker

This pattern is worked from the bottom up

Make 2  
Ch 21

- Row 1 sc in first ch from hook and in each ch across (20 sc) ch1 , turn (do this at the end of EACH row)  
Row 2 2 sc in first 2 sc, sc in each sc to last sc. 2 sc in last sc. (23 sc)  
Row 3 Repeat row 2 (26 sc)  
Row 4 2sc in first sc, sc in each sc across to last 2 sc. 2 sc in each of last 2 sc. (29sc)  
Row 5 repeat from 2 (32 sc)  
Row 6 2sc in first sc, sc across to last. 2sc in last sc (34 sc)  
Row 7 Repeat row 6 (36 sc)  
Row 8 Repeat row 2 (39 sc)  
Row 9 sc in each sc to last sc. 2 sc in last sc (40 sc)  
Row 10 Repeat row 9 (41 sc)  
Row 11 Repeat row 9 (42 sc)  
Row 12 2 sc in first sc (place marker in first sc) sc in each across to end. (43 sc)

You will now work a short row and start the bottom upward curve of the C. You will go back and work the main part of the C later.

- Row 13 2 sc in first sc and in next 15 sc (17 sc)  
Row 14 Dec over first 2 sc, sc in next 15 sc (16 sc)  
Row 15 sc in each sc to last 2 sc. Dec over last 2 sc (15 sc)  
Row 16 Dec over first 3 sc, sc in each sc to end (13 sc)  
Row 17 Dec over first 2 sc, sc in each to last 2 sc. Dec over last 3 sc. (10 sc)  
Row 18 Dec over first 2 sc, sc in each sc to last 2 sc. Dec over last 2 sc. (8 sc)  
Row 19 Dec over first 2 sc, sc in each sc to last 2 sc. Dec over last 2 sc (6 sc)  
Finish off

Go back to marked stitch, join with sc.

- Row 13 sc in same stitch as joining (a total of 2 sc in stitch) sc in next 20 sc (22 sc)  
Row 14 Dec over next 3 sc, sc in each sc to end (20 sc)  
Row 15 2 sc in first sc, sc in each to last 2 sc, Dec over last 2 sc (20 sc)  
Row 16 Dec over first 2 sc, sc in each sc across (19 sc)  
Row 17 2 sc in first sc, sc in each to end (20 sc)  
Row 18 Dec over first 2 sc, sc in each sc to end (19 sc)  
Row 19 sc in each sc across (19 sc)  
Row 20 Dec over first 2 sc, sc in each sc to last sc. 2sc in last sc (19 sc)  
Row 21 -31 sc in each sc across (19 sc)  
Row 32 sc in each sc to last 2 sc, dec over last 2 sc (18 sc)  
Row 33 sc in each sc across (18 sc)

Row 34 repeat row 33 (18 sc)  
Row 35 Dec over first 2 sc, sc in each to end (17 sc)  
Row 36 2 sc in first sc, sc to end (18 sc)  
Row 37 Dec over first 2 sc, sc in each sc across (17 sc)  
Row 38 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc across (18 sc)  
Row 39 Dec over first 2 sc, sc to last sc. 2 sc in last sc (do not finish off) ch 28  
Row 40 sc in first ch from hook (place marker in the chain area of this stitch)  
Sc in each ch across. Sc in next 18 sc (a total of 45 sc now made)  
Row 41 Dec over first 2 sc, sc in each sc to end (44 sc)  
Row 42 Dec over first 2 sc, sc in each sc to last 2 sc. Dec over last 2 sc (42 sc)  
Row 43 repeat row 42 (40 sc)  
Row 44 repeat row 42 (38 sc)  
Row 45 repeat row 42 (36 sc)  
Row 46 repeat row 42 (34 sc)  
Row 47 repeat row 42 (32 sc)  
Row 48 repeat row 42 (30 sc)  
Row 49 repeat row 42 (28 sc)  
Row 50 repeat row 42 (26 sc)  
Row 51 repeat row 42 (24 sc)  
Row 52 repeat row 42 (22 sc)  
Row 53 repeat row 42 (20 sc)  
Row 54 repeat row 42 (18 sc)

#### Finish Off

Return to marked stitch (chain stitch)

Row 1 join with sc and sc in next 18 sc (19 sc)  
Row 2 Dec over next 2 sc, sc in each sc across (18 sc)  
Row 3 sc in each sc to last 2 sc. Dec over last 2 sc (17 sc)  
Row 4 repeat row 2 (16 sc)  
Row 5 repeat row 3 (15 sc)  
Row 6 repeat row 2 (14 sc)  
Row 7 sc in each sc across (14 sc)  
Row 8 Dec over first 2 sc, sc to last 2 sc. Dec over last 2 sc (12 sc)  
Row 9 sc in each sc to last 2 sc. Dec in last 2 sc (11 sc)  
Row 10 Dec over first 2 sc, sc in each sc across (10 sc)  
Row 11 Dec over first 2 sc, sc in each sc across to last 2 sc. Dec over last 2 sc (8 sc)  
Row 12 repeat row 11 (6 sc)

Finish off

When done with both letters, lay one on top of the other. You will be working the "wrong sides" so if you want one color for the front and a different one for the back, place the back color on top of the front color. Slip stitch or whip stitch around. Leave a small opening to stuff fiberfill. Stuff firmly. Close opening.
