Letter "D"

A Woven and Spun Creation



\*this letter was stitched together without flipping right side out\*

Materials

Worsted Weight Yarn

Size I Crochet hook ( a smaller hook will produce a tighter stitch and smaller letter)

Polyester Fiber Fill

Stitch Markers

This letter is worked from the bottom up

Special Stitch Information: Double Foundation Chain - - chain 2, work one single crochet in the first chain made. Insert the hook under the left-handed thread of the last single crochet made, work another single crochet. Repeat step 2 as required. (this stitch will be done later in the project)

Make 2

## Ch 44

Row 1 sc in first sc from hook and in each ch to end (43 sc). ch 1, turn throughout

Row 2 2 sc in first 2 sc. sc in each sc to last sc. 2 sc in last sc. (46 sc)

Row 3 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc to last sc. 2 sc in last sc. (48 sc)

Row 4 2 sc in first sc. sc in each sc to end (49 sc)

Row 5 sc in first sc. sc in each sc to last sc. 2 sc in last sc (50 sc)

Row 6 2 sc in first sc. sc in each sc to end. (51 sc)

Row 7 sc in each sc to last sc. 2 sc in last sc (52 sc)

Row 8 2 sc in first sc. sc in each sc to last 2 sc. Dec over last 2 sc (52 sc)

Row 9 Dec over first 2 sc. sc in each sc to last sc. 2 sc in last sc (52 sc)

Place stitch marker in first stitch of this row

Row 10 2 sc in first sc, sc in next 22 sc (24 sc)

Row 11 dec over first 3 sc, sc in each sc to end (22 sc )

Row 12 2 sc in first sc. sc to last 2 sc. Dec over last 2 sc (22 sc)

Row 13 Dec over first 2 sc. sc to end (21 sc)

Row 14 2 sc in first sc. sc to last 2 sc. Dec over last 2 sc (21 sc)

Row 15 sc in each sc to end (21 sc)

Row 16 2 sc in first sc. sc in each sc to last 2 sc. Dec over last 2 sc (21 sc)

Row 17 -19 sc in each sc to end (21 sc)

Row 20 sc in each sc to last 2 sc. Dec over last 2 sc (20 sc)

Row 21-32 sc in each sc to end (20 sc)

Row 33 2 sc in first sc. sc in each sc to end (21 sc)

Row 34-36 sc in each sc to end (21 sc)

Row 37 2 sc in first sc. sc in each sc to end (22 sc)

Row 38 sc in each sc to end (22 sc)

Row 39 sc in each sc to last 2 sc. Dec over last 2 sc (21 sc)

Row 40 sc in each sc to last sc. 2 sc in last sc (22 sc)

Row 41 2 sc in first sc. sc in each sc to last 2 sc. Dec over last 2 sc (22 sc)

Row 42 sc in each sc to last sc. 2 sc in last sc (23 sc)

Row 43 2 sc in first sc. sc in each sc to last 2 sc. Dec over last 2 sc (23 sc)

Row 44 sc in each sc to last 2 sc. 2 sc in each of last 2 sc (25 sc)

Finish off

Return to marked stitch

Row 10 Dec over first 2 sc. sc in next 22 sc (23 sc)

Row 11 Dec over first 2 sc. sc in each sc to end (22 sc)

Row 12 Dec over first 2 sc. sc in each sc to last 2 sc. Dec over last 2 sc (20 sc)

Row 13-43 sc in each sc to end (20 sc)

Row 44 sc in each sc to last sc. 2 sc in last sc (21 sc )

Finish off

Return to first stitch of last row worked

Row 45 join with sc in first sc. sc in next 20 sc. work special stitch for 5 stitches then join with other side of letter by working sc in first stitch of that row and in each sc to end of row (51 sc)

Row 46 Dec over first 2 sc. sc in each sc to last 2 sc. 2 sc in each of last 2 sc (52 sc)

Row 47 2 sc in first 2 sc. sc in each sc to last 2 sc. Dec over last 2 sc (53 sc)

Row 48. Dec over first 3 sc. sc in each sc to end (51 sc)

Row 49 sc in each sc to last 2 sc. Dec over last 2 sc (50 sc)

Row 50 Dec over first 3 sc. sc in each sc to end (48 sc)

Row 51 sc in each sc to last 2 sc. Dec over last 2 sc (47 sc)

Row 52 Dec over first 3 sc. sc in each sc to end (45 sc)

Row 53 Dec over first 2 sc. sc in each sc to last 3 sc. Dec over last 3 sc (42 sc)

Row 54 Dec over first 3 sc. sc in each sc to last 3 sc. Dec over last 3 sc (38 sc)

Finish Off

Instructions for an "invisible seam"

When done with both letters, lay one on top of the other. You will be working the "wrong sides" so if you want one color for the front and a different one for the back, place the back color on top of the front color. Slip stitch or whip stitch around. Leave a small opening to stuff fiberfill. Stuff firmly. Close opening. You will find it easier to work the outside of the letter, turn and then work the inside part of the letter.

For the seam shown above,

Lay D's on top of each other and slip stitch around leaving a small opening for the stuffing. Once firmly stuffed, close opening.
