

Alphabet Pillow Blocks  
Letter "J"  
Pattern by Kimberly Lewis  
A Woven and Spun Creation



This pattern is dedicated to the "J's" in my life...James, Josh, Jacob, and Jessica.



Materials

Worsted Weight Yarn

Size I Crochet hook ( a smaller hook will produce a tighter stitch and smaller letter)

Polyester Fiber Fill

Stitch Marker

Finished size...approx 14 x 14

Make 2

Ch 19

Row 1 sc in first chain from hook and in each chain across (18 sc). Ch 1, turn.

Row 2 2sc in first sc, sc in each sc to last sc, 2sc in last sc (20 sc). Ch 1, turn.

Row 3 2sc in first two sc, sc in each sc across to last 2sc. 2sc in each of the last 2 sc. (24 sc). Ch 1, turn  
Row 4 Repeat row 3 (28 sc). Ch 1, turn  
Row 5 2sc in first sc, sc in each sc across to last 2sc. 2sc in each of the last 2sc. (31 sc). Ch 1, turn.  
Row 6 2sc in first sc, sc in each sc to last sc. 2sc in last sc. (33 sc). Ch 1, turn  
Row 7 Repeat row 6 (35 sc). Ch 1, turn.  
Row 8 Repeat row 6 (37 sc). Ch 1, turn.  
Row 9 Repeat row 6 (39 sc). Ch 1, turn.  
Row 10 sc in each sc across (39 sc). Ch 1, turn.  
Row 11 2 sc in first sc (place stitch marker in first stitch), sc in each sc to last sc. 2 sc in last sc. (41 sc) Ch1, turn.

You will now work the curve part of the J and go back later to work the stem and top part of it later. So only part of the row will be worked.

Row 12 sc in first sc and in next 17 sc (18 sc). Ch 1, turn.  
Row 13 1 Dec over next 2 sc, sc in each sc across (17 sc). Ch 1, turn.  
Row 14 sc in each stitch across (17 sc). Ch 1, turn.  
Row 15 2 sc in first sc, sc in remaining across. (18 sc). Ch 1, turn.  
Row 16-19 sc in each stitch across (18 sc). Ch 1, turn.  
Row 20 1 Dec over first 2 sc, sc in next 14 sc, 1 dec over last 2 sc. (16 sc). Ch 1, turn  
Row 21 1 dec over first two sc, sc in each sc to end (15 sc). Ch 1, turn.  
Row 22 Repeat row 20 (13 sc). Ch 1, turn.  
Row 23 Repeat row 20 (11 sc). Ch 1, turn  
Row 24 Dec over first 3 sc, sc in next 5 sc, dec over last 3 sc. (7 sc). Ch 1, turn.

Finish Off

Return to marked stitch on row 12.

Row 12 2 sc in first sc, sc in next 19 sc (21 sc). Ch 1, turn.  
Row 13 Dec over first 2 sc, sc in each til end. (20 sc). Ch 1, turn.  
Row 14 sc in each sc across (20 sc). Ch 1, turn.  
Row 15 Dec over first 2 sc, sc in each sc across (19 sc). Ch 1, turn.  
Row 16-41 sc in each sc across (19 sc). Ch 1, turn  
Row 42 sc in each sc to end, 2 sc in last sc (20 sc). Ch 1, turn.  
Row 43 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc to last, 2 sc in last sc. (22 sc). Ch 1, turn  
Row 44 2 sc in first 2 sc, sc in each sc to last, 2 sc in last 2 sc (26 sc). Ch 1, turn.  
Row 45 Repeat Row 44 (30 sc). Ch 1, turn.

Row 46 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc across to last sc, 2 sc in last sc. (32 sc).  
Ch 1, turn.

Row 47 -50 sc in each sc across (32 sc). Ch 1, turn.

Row 51 Dec over first 2 sc, sc in each sc to last 2 sc. Dec over last 2 sc. (30 sc). Ch 1, turn.

Row 52. Repeat row 51 (28 sc), Ch 1, turn

Row 53 Repeat row 51 (26 sc). Ch 1, turn.

Row 54 Repeat row 51 (24 sc). Ch 1, turn.

When done with both letters, lay on on top of the other. You will be working the "wrong sides" so if you want one color for the front and a different one for the back, place the back color on top of the front color. Slip stitch or whip stitch around. Leave a small opening to stuff fiberfill. Stuff firmly. Close opening.
